Reservations & Refunds: Your spot is secured once fees and forms are received. We reserve the right to limit attendance or cancel camps with full refunds as needed. Contact us directly for late registration (\$300, space-permitting). Cancellations a week or more before camp start = full refund minus \$25. No refunds issued after that.

Disciplinary Policy: These camps focus on chess learning and competition; disruptive behavior is not tolerated. Repeated infractions or physical/emotional aggression may result in immediate dismissal with no refund.

³ *Brilliances and Howlers! – Chess to excite! This digital era dazzles and entertains us... as well as leaves us confounded and shaking our heads! Students experience the best and worst from today's speed-demon favorites like Carlsen, Nakamura, Firouza, Nepo, Pragg — and the list goes on...!*

⁴ *Turbochess! – Phenomenal games of historic titans and current digital-era maestros will be hi-lighted to enlighten and inspire the student. Game selections from 150+ years of world class players like Anderssen, Morphy (1800s), Lasker, Alekhine, Tal, Fischer, Kasparov (1900s) to current-century players like Anand, Carlsen, Ding and Gukesh.*
